PSO "Mango Suite" Project at Richardson

The Princeton Symphony Orchestra (PSO) explores cultural identity in literature and music through two separate, yet linked events making up its Mango Suite Project: the Saturday, May 18, 3 p.m. author event with 2015 National Medal of Arts winner and author of *The House of Mango Street*, Sandra Cisneros and the Sunday, May 19, 4 p.m. world premiere performance of Derek Bermel's *Mango Suite* by the PSO. Both events take place at Richardson Auditorium.

Centered on Cisneros' book and Derek Bermel's recent work, the Mango Suite Project has captured the interest of the Princeton community with the Princeton Public Library, Princeton University Art Museum, and Labyrinth Books helping to spread word of its events. According to PSO Executive Director Marc Uys, "The Project allows us to demonstrate how artistic mediums can combine to bring into focus important issues like cultural identity."

The 3 p.m., May 18 free author event features Sandra Cisneros speaking with Grammy-nominated composer Derek Bermel about her experiences growing up amidst two cultures and its impact on her writing of *The House on Mango Street*. Guest vocalist Paulina Villarreal and pianist Steven Beck will perform excerpts from Derek Bermel's *Mango Suite*, which draws inspiration from several of the book's vignettes. Presented in partnership with the Princeton Public Library and Princeton University Art Museum, the event is intended to foster a community-wide dialogue around challenges faced by Princeton's Latinx immigrant community today. The free event includes a post-discussion book signing. Labyrinth Books will be selling copies of *The House on Mango Street* and other titles by Cisneros in the Richardson Auditorium lobby beginning at 2 p.m. Although the event is free, admission tickets are required and are available by phone at (609) 497-0020 or online at princetonsymphony.org.

Edward T. Cone Music Director Rossen Milanov conducts the 4 p.m., May 19 PSO concert featuring the World Premiere Derek Bermel's *Mango Suite* with Mexican mezzo-soprano Paulina Villarreal. Also on the program are three works by Manuel de Falla: *El amor brujo*, *The Three-Cornered Hat*, *Suite No. 1*, and *La vida breve*, *Spanish Dance No. 1*. Two of these works will feature the artistry of flamenco dancer Griseta Damas-Roche. Milanov will host Derek Bermel and Sandra Cisneros in a pre-concert talk taking place in Richardson Auditorium at 3 p.m., and open to concert ticket holders. Concert attendees are invited to a post-concert reception at the Princeton University Art Museum which is currently exhibiting "Miracles on the Border: Retablos of Mexican Migrants to the United States."

Paulina Villarreal is a prominent recitalist, cabaret, operatic, and musical theater singer. She was recently named one of the top prize winners at the international Lotte Lenya Competition in New York and at the Comic Opera Guild Competition in Michigan. A graduate of the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, she has been a soloist with companies and orchestras around the United States including Opera Saratoga, Cincinnati Opera, Opera Fusion: New Works, the prestigious Tanglewood Music Center, the Boston Pops, Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, and Kentucky Symphony Orchestra. Villarreal is the founder and artistic director of the annual concert series *Cantos para Hermanar al Mundo*, devoted to the promotion of classical vocal genres hosted in Northern Mexico.

Griseta Damas-Roche was born in Havana, Cuba, and after 12 years of a professional ballet career at the National Institute of Art of Cuba, her interests moved to flamenco and Spanish classical ballet, spurring her to the position of soloist in the Spanish Ballet of Cuba. Eventually, she made her way to Columbus, Ohio, where she currently teaches flamenco at her U Will Dance Studio while continuing a professional dance career. She was invited by the Columbus Symphony Orchestra to dance with them at the Ohio Theater in 2018 and 2019 as a part of the Spanish Festival, and by the Chautauqua Institution to perform in its 2018 Summer Season. In 2019, she won a grant from Greater Columbus Arts Council to attend the International Festival of Flamenco in Albuquerque, N.M.

Westminster Foundation To Hold Public Meeting On Survival of Campus

With Rider University planning to move Westminster Choir College from its long-time Princeton home to the University's Lawrence Township campus next fall, those who fear the relocation would spell the end of the esteemed music school are gearing up for what is billed as "A Critical Public Meeting" set for Tuesday, September 10 at Nassau Presbyterian Church. The meeting is not a forum or a debate. It is an information session, which will include a video about Westminster and a question-and-answer session after the presentation. "This is something we started formulating about a month ago as an opportunity to get out to the public what is really going on," said Constance Fee, who heads the Westminster Foundation, a group of alumni, faculty, and various supporters of the choir college. "The PR from Rider is that this move is all wonderful. But we want to let people know what is actually going on in the background." Rider merged with Westminster in 1991. The University announced plans

Riverside On Track for a Thursday Opening

After massive cleanup of construction dust and debris over the past few days, with custodial crews working alongside a professional cleaning company throughout the Labor Day weekend, Riverside Elementary School will be opening on Thursday, September 5, a day after the other Princeton Public Schools (PPS). "Riverside passed inspection by the health officer this morning and is on track for a great opening on Thursday," PPS Superintendent Steve Cochrane wrote in an email Tuesday afternoon. In other school news this week, the New Jersey Department of Education has approved PPS' application for preschool expansion aid with \$770,939 in additional funding. The funding will enable the district to offer, free of charge, a new dual language immersion preschool class at Community Park School and a new class for 3-year-olds in partnership with the YWCA, as well as continuing to offer preschool classes at Johnson Park and Riverside. **Cleanup Delays** As teachers returned to Riverside last week to prepare for this week's scheduled opening, construction crews, which had

installed new HVAC units in most of the classrooms, were still completing their work and cleanup. Many teachers, according to Riverside teachers' union representative Christina Dillio, were experiencing headaches, burning throats, and coughing. Cochrane noted "significant levels of dust and debris left from the construction," and he and Riverside Principal Mark Shelley sent an email letter to parents last Friday announcing that the first day of school would

be delayed until Thursday, September 5. Emphasizing concern for health and wellness of staff and students, the letter stated that the work done over the summer "has had a profound impact on our infrastructure and our normal process and timeline for school preparation - particularly in these waning days of August." In responding to additional concerns raised by parents and staff members, Cochrane and Shelley noted that the

Bainbridge House to Reopen With Neighborhood Block Party

The renovations are complete. Bainbridge House, the red brick, Georgian-style building at 158 Nassau Street, is ready to reopen as a public viewing space programmed by the Princeton University Art Museum. On Saturday, September 14 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., a block party for the community will celebrate the new life of the historic structure, rechristened Art@Bainbridge. The Museum plans to use the first floor as gallery space for displaying the work of contemporary artists. The first installation,

"Jordan Nassau: Between Sky and Earth" shows works created by the 34-year-old artist during the last five years. This focus on the new is intentional. It contrasts the notable history of Bainbridge House, which stretches back to the mid-1700s and includes years as lodging for members of the Continental Congress in 1783. Earlier, it served as the home and medical office of Absalom Bainbridge, an enslaved person who successfully battled for freedom.

Grief is a public health issue. According to Dr. Robert Block, past president of the American Academy of Pediatrics, "Adverse Childhood Experiences are the single greatest unaddressed public health threat facing our nation today." Childhood bereavement is not a public health outlier; it is a consistently unaddressed public health threat.

According to the AAG Institute, one out of seven children experience the death of a parent or sibling before the age of 25 in New Jersey. 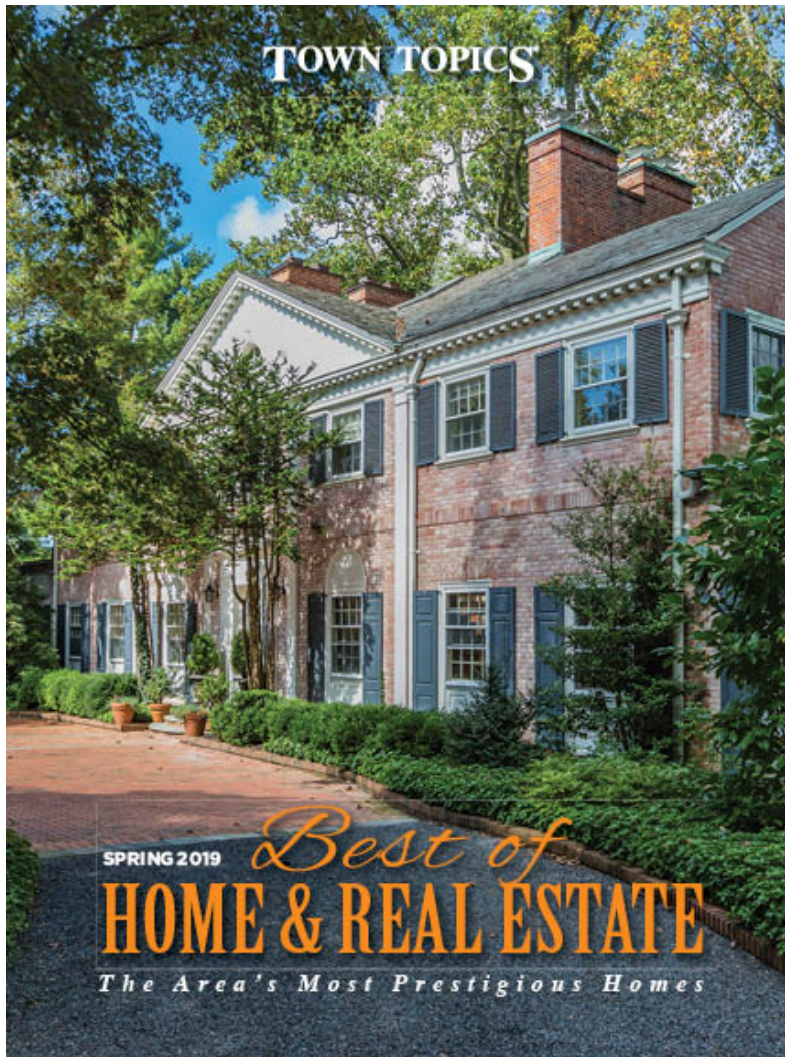

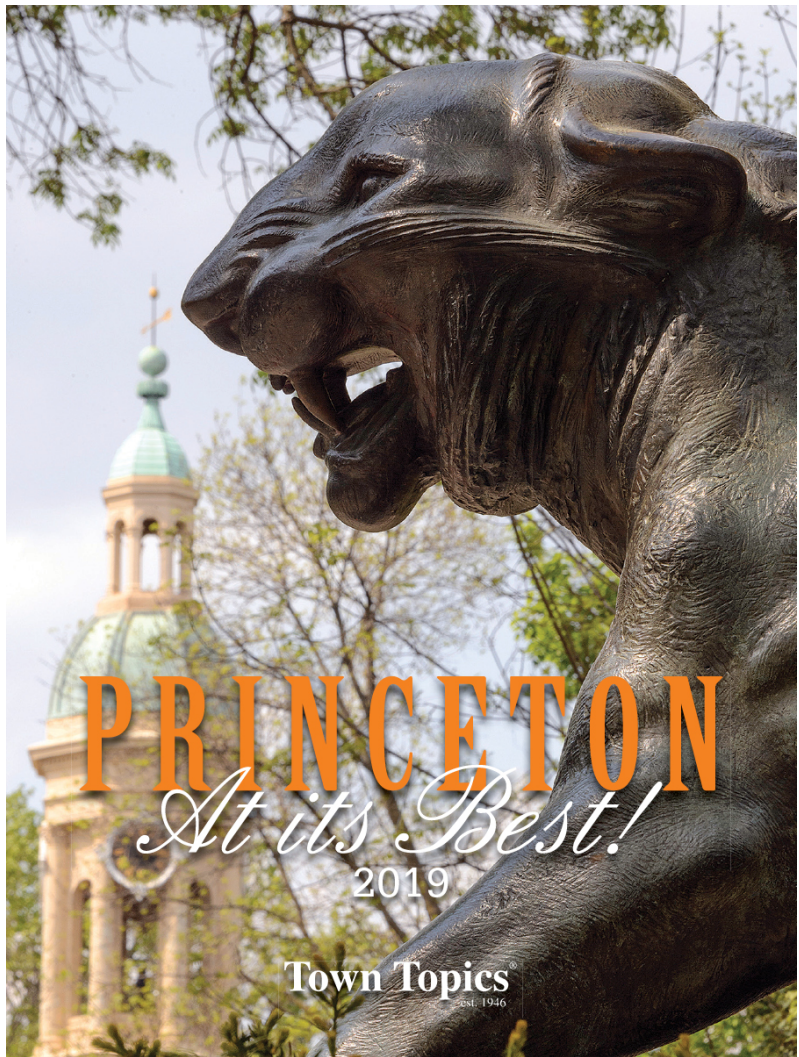
