Ukrainian-born pianist to be featured in online Princeton Symphony concert

The <u>Princeton Symphony Orchestra</u> will post a recorded performance of "<u>Mozart &</u> <u>Saint-Georges</u>" 4 p.m. Sunday, Jan. 10.

Conducted by music director <u>Rossen Milanov</u>, the program will feature Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's Serenade for Winds in C Minor, K. 388 and Joseph Bologne, Le Chevalier de Saint-Georges' Symphony No. 1 in G Major. Ukrainian-born pianist <u>Alexander Gavrylyuk</u> will be guest soloist, performing works for solo piano by Mozart, Johannes Brahms and Arkady Filippenko.

Born in Ukraine in 1984 and holding Australian citizenship, Gavrylyuk began his piano studies at age 7 and gave his first concerto performance when he was 9. He currently is is artist in residence at Chautauqua Institution, where he leads the piano program as an artistic adviser.

The concert streaming will be supplemented by a live chat and will be available for ondemand viewing for one week after its initial posting.
