

ABOUT THE ARTISTS



Samantha Dunster
Director of Artistic Operations
American Repertory Ballet

Samantha Dunster began her ballet training in Toronto, Ontario. At the age of 17, she traveled to Havana to train with the National Ballet of Cuba. She continued dancing with the company of Centro Pro-Danza, under the direction of Laura Alonso, where she also

worked as Regisseur and Ballet Mistress. In 1996, Samantha accepted the position of Artistic Director and Principal Dancer of Bale da Ilha in Brazil. By 2000, she became Ballet Mistress of Orlando Ballet under the late Fernando Bujones and in 2007, she accepted the position of Assistant to the Artistic Director of Orlando Ballet, under the direction of Bruce Marks. During her time in Orlando she staged *La Fille Mal Gardée* and premiered her production of *Camelot*. In 2011, Samantha accepted the position of Artistic Director of the Hartt Community Division Dance Department at the University of Hartford. During that time, she created and choreographed two new full-length ballets: *Snow White* and *Peter Pan*. In 2014, she became Ballet Mistress with Philadelphia Ballet and was then appointed Assistant Artistic Director the following year. Samantha has traveled extensively setting ballets in places such as South Korea, Sweden, Argentina, and Japan.

Ethan Stiefel is an internationally recognized artist, educator, and leader in the performing arts. After serving as American Repertory Ballet's Artistic Director for over three years, he is currently The Nora C. Orphanides Artist in Residence. In 1989, Stiefel began his

professional career at age 16 with the New York City Ballet where he quickly rose to the rank of Principal Dancer. Stiefel was also a Principal Dancer with Ballett Zurich followed by being a Principal Dancer with American Ballet Theatre (ABT) from 1997-2012. Stiefel has served as Dean of the School of Dance at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts (UNCSA) as well as the Artistic Director of the Royal New Zealand Ballet. As a choreographer, he has created new works for American Repertory Ballet, the Royal New Zealand Ballet, The Washington Ballet, ABT Studio Company, Northern Ballet (UK), The Royal Ballet School, UNCSA, *Jimmy Kimmel Live!* and for the television series *Flesh and Bone* (STARZ) and *And Just Like That* (Season 3, HBO). Stiefel has

received a number of prestigious awards such as the Statue Award of the Princess Grace Foundation and the *Dance Magazine* Award.

Rossen Milanov Edward T. Cone Music Director Princeton Symphony Orchestra

Rossen Milanov looks forward to collaborating in 2025-26 with established and emerging artists of the orchestral world and helming the PSO's popular June performing arts celebration – The Princeton Festival.

Respected and admired by audiences and musicians alike, he has established himself as a conductor with considerable national and international presence. In addition to leading the PSO, Mr. Milanov is the music director of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra and the Chautaugua Symphony Orchestra.

During his eleven-year tenure with The Philadelphia Orchestra, he conducted more than 200 performances. In 2015, he completed a 15-year tenure as music director of the nationally recognized training orchestra Symphony in C in New Jersey and in 2013, a 17-year tenure with the New Symphony Orchestra in his native city of Sofia, Bulgaria. Mr. Milanov has collaborated with Komische Oper Berlin (Shostakovich's *Lady Macbeth of Mtzensk*), Opera Oviedo with the Spanish premiere of Tchaikovsky's *Mazzepa* and Bartok's *Bluebeard's Castle* (awarded best Spanish production for 2015), and Opera Columbus (Verdi's *La Traviata* and *Rigoletto* and Tchaikovsky's *Eugene Onegin*). He has been seen at New York City Ballet and collaborated with some of the best-known choreographers of our time such as Mats Ek, Benjamin Millepied, and most recently Alexei Ratmansky in the critically acclaimed revival of *Swan Lake* in Zurich with Zurich Ballet and in Paris with La Scala Ballet.

Mr. Milanov is deeply committed to music education, presenting Link Up education projects with Carnegie Hall and the Orchestra of St. Luke's and leading the PSO's annual BRAVO! concerts for thousands of school children. He was named Bulgaria's Musician of the Year in 2005; he won a 2011 ASCAP award for adventurous programming of contemporary music at the PSO; and he was selected as one of the top 100 most influential people in New Jersey in 2014. In 2017, he was recipient of a Columbus Performing Arts Prize awarded by The Columbus Foundation. He is a graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music and The Juilliard School.
